Abide implements the JJ Way® innovative prenatal care model to reduce maternal and infant mortality rates.</p> <p>Funding from CFT will support midwife salaries and essential medical equipment, furthering Abide's mission to improve healthcare equity and health outcomes in Southern Dallas.</p>
<p><u>African American Education Archives and History Program</u></p> <p>FOCUS AREA: RACIAL EQUITY (EDUCATION)</p>	<p>\$15,000</p>	<p>The African American Education Archives and History Program (AAEAHP) is a volunteer-driven program with a mission to correct the historical narrative of African American educators and civil rights figures in Dallas.
